Islamic History

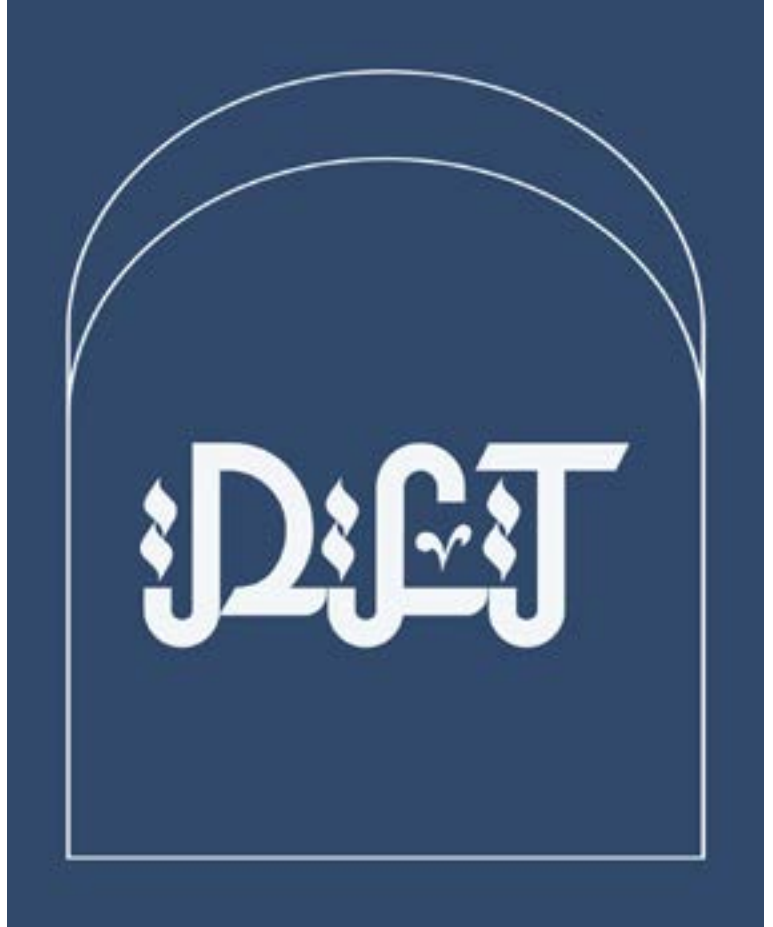

1 - Tasawwaf (Islamic Mysticism)

The Syllabus of Tasawwaf (also known as Islamic Mysticism) goes through the concepts of Tasawwaf and analyses them from the viewpoint of the Qur'an, Sunnah and the methodologies of the Noble Saints. By the end of the course the student should be able to appreciate that Tasawwaf is in fact 'the spirit of the Qur'an and Sunnah'.

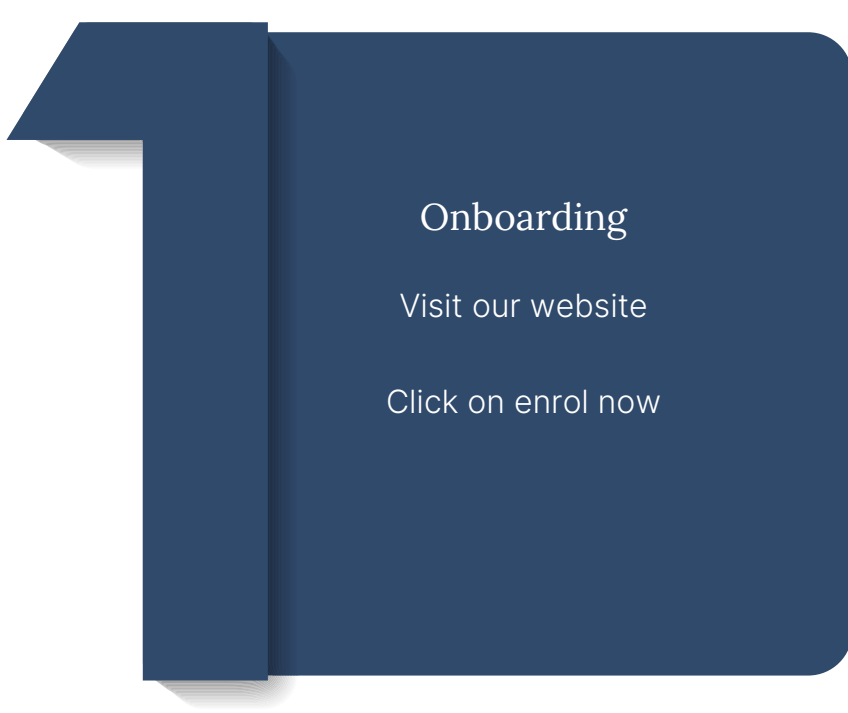
